**Dear Parishioners,**  
**We celebrate the Ascension of the Lord**

**1. The Land of the Living**

It is easy to believe that one will see the good things of the Lord in the land of the living, if he is in the prime of life with everything going well. But how many people are ever in such a condition and for how long? In the midst of all the suffering of this world, how can the Psalmist say, in the voice of every human being, "I believe that I will see the good things of the Lord in the land of the living"?

Well, what are the good things of the Lord? If they are peace, prosperity, health, and things of this sort, then they will be absent from the land of the living for very many people.

What could be more precious than this intimacy of shared suffering with the Lord? The Second Reading for the Seventh Sunday gives a different sense of the good things, though. The things people rejoice in are the good things, aren't they? The second reading recommends rejoicing when one shares in the sufferings of the Lord.

It is not so hard to see that there might be a reward in heaven for such shared suffering. But why would anyone suppose it is a good thing in the land of the living?

When the Lord suffered on the cross, those suffering with him were his closest companions. His mother was there, and so was his beloved disciple John. There is an intimacy in the union of shared suffering that is precious even as between human beings. What could be more precious than this intimacy of shared suffering with the Lord? In the Second Reading, Peter says that it is glorious.

This is a good thing that the wealthy of the world do not have a monopoly of. The Psalmist is right, then. Anyone can hope for the good things of the Lord in the land of the living.

## 2. First Holy Communion

The children preparing for their First Holy Communion have their last lesson tomorrow night, Monday, in the parish hall.

The following Monday night, June 5, will be a practise night in the Church for our candidates.

The celebration of the Sacrament for them and their families will be on Sunday June 18 at the special time of 10.30am.

## 3. Paschal Precept



A reminder of the Paschal Precept that obliges all Catholics to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year, as well as receiving Holy Communion at least once a year (as a minimum).

The Paschal Precept is from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday (10 June). This is to acknowledge that Jesus died on the cross for my sins and sinfulness.

## 4. Getting Married?

As parents and grandparents it is difficult to sometimes interfere in your child or grandchild's place of the wedding ceremony.

However, we all need to remember that Marriage for baptised Catholics is a Sacrament (the Sacrament of Matrimony) and therefore, a Catholic should marry in the Catholic Church.

This is one of the six Laws of the Church!

### **Please Note**

1. If a Catholic and partner marry in another Church either Protestant or Orthodox the Catholic needs to seek permission through their Parish Priest to do so. This permission is given more readily today than in previous years! Please see Fr Bob.
2. If a Catholic marries in a non-sacred space eg garden etc the marriage is invalid and is non-sacramental. In this instance, the Catholic partner or the Catholic couple cannot receive or take any Sacraments UNTIL they have re-married in the Church before the Priest and two witnesses.
3. If a Catholic married, but the marriage relationship broke down for whatever reason, the Catholic needs to apply for an annulment of their marriage before they can enter into a new relationship and marry in the Church.

Please Note: The annulment process can go ahead whether there were children born in the relationship or not.

We need to talk to the Parish Priest and get the information and apply for an annulment from the Sydney Tribunal.

# POPE FRANCIS COLUMN



## Pope at Morning Mass: For Denouncing Worldliness, Good Consecrated Are Persecuted

At Casa Santa Marta, Francis Recalls Tragic Fate of Blessed Oscar Romero Consecrated people, Pope Francis says, have been persecuted for denouncing attitudes of worldliness, because the evil spirit prefers a riskless and lukewarm Church.

According to Vatican Radio, Pope Francis made this observation during his daily morning Mass at Casa Santa Marta, as he recalled Chapter 16 of the Acts of the Apostles, and stories of Paul and Silas in Philip. Two years after beatification, the Pope remembered the Archbishop of San Salvador. Blessed Oscar Romero was killed by military squadrons linked to the military regime for denouncing violence against the poor.

In his homily, Francis decried how many are persecuted for telling the truth. “This is repeated in the history of salvation,” he stressed.

“In the Church,” he said, “when someone denounces so many ways of worldliness, he is looked at with crooked eyes.”

“I remember in my land many so many men and women who were good consecrated [people], not ideologues, but who said, ‘No, the Church of Jesus is so ...’ – ‘This is communist, out!’ And they threw them away, They persecuted them,” he said.

“Think of the Blessed Romero, right? What happened to tell the truth. And many, many in the history of the Church, even here in Europe. Because? Because the evil spirit prefers a tranquil, risk-free Church, a business church, a comfortable church, in the comfort of warmth, lukewarm.”

Francis also noted that the bad spirit always comes from the pockets, and lamented when money takes control.

Besides denouncing this corruption, Francis turned to the importance of joyfully announcing Jesus. He stressed the need for joy.

“And this is the path of our daily conversion: to move from a worldly, tranquil, safe, Catholic, yes, yes, but cozy, state of life, to the true proclamation of Jesus Christ, to the joy of Christ’s announcement.”

“To move from a religion that looks too much on earnings, [to] faith, and proclaiming: “Jesus is the Lord.” This, he said, is the miracle that the Holy Spirit does.

Before concluding, Pope Francis highlighted: “A Church without martyrs gives mistrust; A Church that does not risk gives mistrust; A Church that is afraid to announce Jesus Christ and to drive away demons, idols, other ‘lords’, such as money, is not the Church of Jesus.”

## Pope Sends Telegram for Terrorist Attack at Concert in Manchester

'His Holiness Pope Francis was deeply saddened to learn of the injury and tragic loss of life caused by the barbaric attack in Manchester, and he expresses his heartfelt solidarity with all those affected by this senseless act of violence'

Pope Francis has sent his condolences to the victims of the terrorist attack last evening, May 22, 2017 in Manchester, toward the conclusion of the concert of young American singer, Ariana Grande. The explosion, thought to be terrorism, claimed the lives of at least 22 people and injured some 59 others.

Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, sent the telegram on the Pope's behalf.

Below is the Vatican-provided text of the Pope's message:

His Holiness Pope Francis was deeply saddened to learn of the injury and tragic loss of life caused by the barbaric attack in Manchester, and he expresses his heartfelt solidarity with all those affected by this senseless act of violence. He commends the generous efforts of the emergency and security personnel, and offers the assurance of his prayers for the injured, and for all who have died. Mindful in a particular way of those children and young people who have lost their lives, and of their grieving families, Pope Francis invokes God's blessings of peace, healing and strength upon the nation.
