Dear Parishioners,

We celebrate the Twentysecond Sunday in Ordinary Time

1. Does God want us to be Happy?

Does God want us to be happy? How could anyone answer 'no'? How
could anyone suppose God is loving if it is not true that he wants us to
be happy?

And yet look at Christ's line in the Gospel Reading. Deny yourself, Jesus
tells his faithful followers; take up your cross and follow me.

Denying yourself seems the opposite of going for happiness, doesn't it?

And the cross is an instrument of torture. Why would God want these
things for his people? Does God want us to be *unhappy*?

A man divorcing his dowdy wife to marry a much younger, prettier
woman explained his decision to his devastated wife this way: "God
wants me to be happy," he told her, "and I can't be happy with *you*. I *will*
be happy with her."

No one can be happy whose heart has deep within it a willingness to
crush others to get what he wants.

It seems never to have crossed the mind of this man that God might
have any care for the happiness of his wife. As far as his wife was
concerned, the husband's full view of the matter could be put this way:
"God wants *me* to be happy, but God doesn't give a damn about *you*."

This little story is common in its selfishness. But we should not let our
familiarity with its callous disregard for the suffering of others blind us.

Whether it is these familiar evils or the terrible shocking evils we see in
the news, these evils show us the sickness of the post-fall human
condition. We are willing to privilege our own power or pleasure over any
greater goods, even at the cost of cruelty to others.

We can't be happy in *this* condition. No one can be happy whose heart
has deep within it a willingness to crush others to get what he wants.

Well, then, what is to be done with us? What *will* make us happy? What
will save us from the evil that infects us and leaves us so willing to afflict
others?

This is where Christ's cross comes into the story. Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. (Jn 14:6) The cross of Christ is our only route to the happiness God does want for us.

Taking up our cross with Christ is healing for our sinful condition. It is the way to life, and to true joy.

2. Change of Address

About 2 years ago we asked Charles Glanville (Architects) who designed the Church to design a new presbytery for St Anthony's.

When sent here, the Chancellor Monsignor John Usher, told me to build a presbytery to house two priests and a seminarian (student Trainee), who would have pastoral experience in the parish.

As you know from looking for houses they are not cheap!

Besides accommodation, office and separate living areas had to be incorporated into the design, as well as, the other essential household needs. The presbytery had to accommodate all these areas.

The cost was worked at \$1.2 million in today's money. The parish did not have it and after renovating the Church and fixing up the presbytery we were nowhere near that amount.

I invited the head of the Church Development Fund to lunch to discuss our finances but he indicated we would not be able to pay the interest due to what we receive on the 2nd Collection. So, we put it in the too hard basket.

Bishop Randazzo attended a School Master Plan Meeting 10 weeks ago and commented on the presbytery and the living environment. The Bishop approached Sydney Catholic Schools that as they have several properties could they loan one to the parish for use as a presbytery and parish office.

I have accepted their offer and so, we are "moving house" to 320 Edmondson Avenue Austral, keeping the same phone and fax numbers and email address.

My builder will do repairs to the interior of the presbytery as the architraves are breaking up, we had an attack of white ants in the bathroom and some repairs in the kitchen.

I seek your input as to what to do with the presbytery eg: offer it to a young married couple in a reduced rent or offer it to a refugee family that we could foster and assist in establishing themselves in our community. There are many Catholic families that are in need of assistance.

The presbytery and parish office will move on Thursday 31 August.

POPE FRANCIS COLUMN



Vatican City, Aug 28, 2017 / 02:00 am (CNA/EWTN News).- On Monday the Vatican confirmed rumors that have been swirling the past few weeks about a papal visit to Myanmar and Bangladesh, announcing that Pope Francis will visit the two Asian countries Nov. 27-Dec. 2.

“Welcoming the invitation of the respective heads of state and bishops, His Holiness Pope Francis will make an apostolic visit to Myanmar from 27 to 30 November 2017, visiting the cities of Yangon and Nay Pyi Taw,” an Aug. 28 statement from Vatican spokesman Greg Burke read.

The communique also noted that after Myanmar, the Pope will head to Bangladesh “from 30 November to 2 December 2017, visiting the city of Dhaka.” The logo for the trip was also published, and the schedule is expected to be released shortly.

The Pope has been talking about a visit to Asia for several months; however, until now nothing had been confirmed. Still, he managed to slip the visit in just before Christmas.

Though India was initially part of the plan for this year’s Asia trip, a visit to the country had to be cut due to complications with the country’s government.

Despite hopes from all sides, it’s taken longer than anticipated to work out some of the details with the government of Prime Minister Narhendra Modi, a Hindu nationalist seen by many as hostile to India’s Christian minority.

Francis’ decision to visit Bangladesh and Myanmar is not only a shining example of his attention to the peripheries, but it also speaks of the great attention he has placed on Asia since his election.

His second international trip as Pope was a visit to South Korea in August 2014, made in part to celebrate Asian Youth Day, and just five months later, in January 2015, he traveled to Sri Lanka and the Philippines.

The upcoming visit to Myanmar and Bangladesh, then, will mark his third tour of the Asian continent so far in his four-year tenure.


