Dear Parishioners, Today we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Year A

The <u>Gospel</u> reading for this feast is very rich. It invites us to reflect on the difference between true love and its false imitation, between real Christianity and its fake lookalike. It encourages us to exercise ourselves in the care of all God's children. It prompts us to reflect on all the different kinds of hunger there are in the world, and the very different kinds of feeding those various hungers require.

What wouldn't you yourself have given to lay your weary head on the breast of your Lord?

These are all good things to ponder, but there is still more to see. Here is one more thing. Think about what it is for God himself to be incarnate. A human woman took the Lord to her breast and suckled him there. The apostle John reclined by the Lord and laid his head on the bosom of the Lord. A woman washed the Lord's feet with her tears, and a woman rubbed his feet with lotion. How did those people get so lucky? Of all the millions and millions of God's people, how can it be that so few touched God in the flesh, that only one woman anointed his feet? Wouldn't you have liked to be among these very lucky people? In desperately sad and stricken moments, what wouldn't you yourself have given to lay your weary head on the breast of your Lord?

It is good to have a God who enters human history, but anything in history is local, constrained in time and space, cut off from so many things that aren't right here, right now. How can it be that only those few people, who were *there* with Jesus, in that place and at that time, had contact with the Lord flesh to flesh? The answer to this question and the consolation the question seeks is in the <u>Gospel</u> reading: whatever you did to one of the least of my own, the Lord says, you did it to me.

6. Booking for the Mass

We are still encouraging all to think ahead if you will be attending a weekend mass and book on time by ringing the parish office either Tuesday, Thursday or send email. Turning up on the day without booking and without ringing for a spot may put us into a hard decision of not allowing you inside the church for the Mass if the church has reached it maximum. If your name is already on the list, please mark off your name each time you attend the weekend Mass in order to continue maintaining your spot. If you are not coming for a particular Sunday Mass, let the parish secretary know via email or phone so someone will fill the spot. If you missed to come for a particular weekend Mass, please ring the parish office to rebook your availability for subsequent weekend Masses. Otherwise, we take it you are no longer available and we give your spot to a waiting person. In the spirit of charity, let us strive to make our parish a COVID-19 safe place.

8. Columban Calendars

The Columban Calendar is a work of the Columban Fathers and is a fundraiser for their missions, especially in South America. The Calendar has a page a month and a religious painting for each month. 9. Sacrament of Reconciliation

Some families have not returned due to illness or worries about COVID. Again, I encourage those families to streamline Mass either from St Mary's Cathedral at 10.30am Sunday or Wollongong at 9.30am on Sundays. In this way the family or individual is giving time to God and their own spiritual life. But TV Mass is not the answer to attending the community and joining in Sunday worship in hearing the Word of God and then, encountering Jesus in Eucharist. If families or family members have become lazy due to being away from worship then, before receiving the Eucharist in good conscience they should go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist.

10. November Envelopes

November is the month of the Holy Souls, we remember our deceased loved ones. There are November envelopes in the Planned Giving boxes and on the back table. Please put the envelope with your offering and put in the collection plate or give to the priest, Fr Kene.

11. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.

12. Children's Christmas Pageant

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the traditional Christmas pageant that the children of the parish normally participate in on Christmas Eve, will not be occurring. Instead, we are hoping to prerecord an item to be shown at all Masses over Christmas.

Children of primary school age are invited to be involved in this, with preparation etc commencing at 3.15pm on Tuesday 1st December.

Permission forms will be available on the day and must be signed by parents/guardians prior to any filming.
