Dear Parishioners.

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent Year B

1. As we enter the Season of Advent once again, the message of the Readings seems at odds with our modern lifestyle. We are told to wait. To wait! This is an old-fashioned idea in today's world; for the world we live in is a world of instant gratification, instant answers, instant access to information, and if we don't have instant success in what we do, many have a great sense of failure.

As God's people have always done, we wait with impatience. The prophet sees the exile of the Israelites as being abandoned by God, and he begs God to return. The disciples are concerned about when the end time will come, for the early Christian people expected the second coming of Christ soon after the resurrection. These events will occur, but in God's time, not according to our human expectations.

The prayer of the prophet was answered when the Son of God became man in the incarnation. God came to his people, but not in the way the prophet anticipated, with the rending of the heavens and the quaking of the mountains. He came instead as a baby. He did not redeem his people by overthrowing their oppressors, as the disciples anticipated, but by showing them how to live with God and with the world about them. While we wait to celebrate the great event of the incarnation, we pause to reflect on our relationship with God. Do we ignore God as the Israelites did? Do we expect too much of God, expecting God to fit in with our images and expectations? Do we see God as a God of power, as a Father, a potter. Which ever image we identify with, the key to our relationship with God is God's faithfulness. God is always there for us!

Just as God is always there for us, always faithful, so we should always be there for God, aware of his presence, letting ourselves be loved, and loving in return, not just at special moments, but all the time!

The beginning of Advent provides us with an opportunity to reflect on our faithfulness, on our commitment to God and to one another. Making sure of those things is always the proper preparation for God's coming.

## 2. Congratulations to first Holy Communion Candidates

Congratulations to the children who made their First Holy Communion last weekend. This weekend completes the two-week celebration with these children from our parish. 39 candidates made their first Holy Communion this year from our parish. We ask you to continue to remember them in your prayers as we look forward to having them in our weekly celebrations. And I remind you that the two additional masses this weekend are strictly for the Holy Communion candidates and their families in order to prevent COVID-19 spread.

### 3. Advent Program

The Parish Advent program has begun. Last Tuesday went really well and I encourage you to be part of it. The program avails you the opportunity of not only reflecting on the gospel of the coming weekend Mass celebration but also understanding the gospel in question from different points of view without relying only from the priest (preacher)'s view on a Sunday. ## 5. Booking for the Mass

We are still encouraging all to think ahead if you will be attending a weekend mass and book on time by ringing the parish office either Tuesday, Thursday or send email. Turning up on the day without booking and without ringing for a spot may put us into a hard decision of not allowing you inside the church for the Mass if the church has reached it maximum. If your name is already on the list, please mark off your name each time you attend the weekend Mass in order to continue maintaining your spot. If you are not coming for a particular Sunday Mass, let the parish secretary know via email or phone so someone will fill the spot. If you missed to come for a particular weekend Mass, please ring the parish office to rebook your availability for subsequent weekend Masses. Otherwise, we take it you are no longer available and we give your spot to a waiting person. In the spirit of charity, let us strive to make our parish a COVID-19 safe place.

#### 6. Sacrament of Reconciliation

Some families have not returned due to illness or worries about COVID. Again, I encourage those families to streamline Mass either from St Mary's Cathedral at 10.30am Sunday or Wollongong at 9.30am on Sundays. In this way the family or individual is giving time to God and their own spiritual life. But TV Mass is not the answer to attending the community and joining in Sunday worship in hearing the Word of God and then, encountering Jesus in Eucharist. If families or family members have become lazy due to being away from worship then, before receiving the Eucharist in good conscience they should go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist.

#### 7. November Envelopes

November is the month of the Holy Souls, we remember our deceased loved ones.

There are November envelopes in the Planned Giving boxes and on the back table.

Please put the envelope with your offering and put in the collection plate or give to the priest, Fr Kene.

## 8. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.

## 9. From Sydney Archdiocese

Launch of 2020 Lights of Christmas at St Mary's Cathedral

St Mary's Cathedral is again hosting the magnificent lights of Christmas with the event officially being launched on 10 December with the lights display commencing at 8:30pm. The lights will be displayed each night until 11pm, concluding on Christmas Day.

#### COVID-19 update

In a welcome step forward for our churches in the lead up to Christmas, NSW Health has announced that up to 500 people will be allowed at outdoor Masses if fixed seating is made available from 1 December onwards. In this case, a one person per two square metre rule needs to be observed. Up to 300 attendees are allowed at indoor Masses, as long as churches follow a four-square metre rule.

It is important to acknowledge that in practice, only St Mary's Cathedral will be allowed up to 300 attendees at indoor Masses because of its dimensions.

A small number of churches with larger dimensions will now be able to accommodate over 100 people at Masses.
