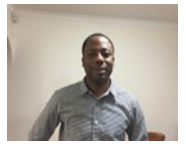

#### **Joy in the Lord**

"I rejoice heartily in the Lord," the prophet says in the [First Reading](#). And why wouldn't he? He has glad tidings. The poor will be taken care of, the brokenhearted will be healed, the captives will be freed, and the prisoners will be released. Who wouldn't rejoice in these things?

#### **How can Mary maintain the words of the Magnificat even at the foot of the cross?**

As the winter dark and cold encroach on our days, and the birth of the baby Jesus draws near, we hear these beautiful words everywhere. But the problem is that, for many people, this is a time of depression, not of joy. And why? Well, because the poor are still poor; people are brokenhearted; and the captives and prisoners are not released. The bank forecloses on the house of a person who has lost his job; a friend is treacherous; a spouse succumbs to alcoholism. What has happened to the promise of the beautiful words? How is joy possible?

The answer lies in Mary's words in the Magnificat. "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Savior," she says. Does anyone think that she took these words back when she stood by the cross as her son was crucified?

How can Mary maintain the words of the Magnificat even at the foot of the cross? The answer is that the greatest love of the Lord was there. The words of joy that Mary spoke, before the Lord was born, are only more true in the suffering she bears at his cross. His love doesn't take away her suffering at his crucifixion. How could it? But her suffering is enveloped in his great love, and so it is transfigured.

Joy in the Lord is compatible with waiting for the final redemption from our suffering and our sin because Christ is Emanuel, God with us. Even now, because his love suffuses all our suffering, our souls can proclaim the greatness of the Lord, and our spirits can rejoice in God.

## 4. Christmas Mass Bookings

Christmas is less than 3 weeks and this year will be unique and different due to COVID-19. To accommodate all worshipers who would like to attend, mass we are having five masses over Christmas . Mass times are Vigil 24th December 5.30pm, 7.30pm and 12 midnight. On Christmas day, 8.30am and 10.30am. Please ring the parish office from **15 December 2020**. It is important that you book for your family only.. We would be disappointed if too many people miss out.. If you would like extended family members to attend they will need to call or email themselves. There will be a maximum of 6 people per booking for the 5.30pm mass.

## 5. Booking for the Mass (Excluding Christmas masses)

We are pleased to announce from 7 December places of worship will change from the 4 square metre rule to 2 square metre rule in our church. That means we can now have up to 150 people at each mass.

Therefore you will not need to make any bookings for the masses prior to Christmas which are the weekends of 12-13 and 19,20 December 2020. Masses will be open to the first 150 people who attend.

You will still need to write your name and contact details on the papers provided. Could you please write one name only on each line and once the booking sheet reaches its capacity please use the next page. Please inform others especially those who have not been coming to church due to previous restrictions of this change and invite them to church.

Our priority is making our parish a covid safe place.

## 6. Sacrament of Reconciliation

Some families have not returned due to illness or worries about COVID. Again, I encourage those families to streamline Mass either from St Mary's Cathedral at 10.30am Sunday or Wollongong at 9.30am on Sundays. In this way the family or individual is giving time to God and their own spiritual life. But TV Mass is not the answer to attending the community and joining in Sunday worship in hearing the Word of God and then, encountering Jesus in Eucharist. If families or family members have become lazy due to being away from worship then, before receiving the Eucharist in good conscience they should go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist.

## 7. Fr Kene to attend burial of his brother

The burial/funeral of Fr Kene's brother Gerald Chukwuemeka Onwukwe has been scheduled to be held on 28/29 January 2021. He is looking forward to taking an annual leave from 18 January to 15 February 2021 to enable him travel to Nigeria for the burial ceremony. Details of travel to be communicated.

## **9. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap**

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.
