Dear Parishioners, Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent Year B

1. In the <u>First Reading</u>, the prophet reports a command given by God: 'Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God!" In the sorrows of life, who does not long for comfort? Who would not melt with gratitude at the tender comfort of God? But what is comfort?

Sometimes what we want is just what the good shepherd gives his lost sheep. We don't want to walk along the road of our life to the Lord. We want God to carry us.

But a child that is carried all the time will never learn to walk, to leap and run. That child, weak enough already to have to be carried, will get only weaker as the carrying goes on. And comfort isn't a matter of giving weakness. It's a matter of giving strength—strength for walking, even over very rough roads.

In fact, the "-fort" in "comfort" comes from the Latin word for "strong." The "com-" in "comfort" is from the Latin word for "with." To give comfort to someone is to lend him some of your strength. He is more able to stand on his own feet and walk because you are with him. But what is the comfort of God? Where is it? How do we find it?

The <u>Gospel</u> says that Christ baptizes his own with the Holy Spirit. Because of this baptism, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell within each person who comes to Christ.

That is why no one who comes to Christ and receives his baptism of the Holy Spirit walks the wild and rocky road of life alone. God is so much with him that, in the person of the Holy Spirit, God is within him. If God is for us, even within us, who can be against us? This is strength indeed.

And so no wonder that the other name for the Holy Spirit is "the Comforter."



We are pleased to announce from 7 December places of worship will change from the 4 square metre rule to 2 square metre rule in our church. That means we can now have up to 150 people at each mass.

Therefore you will not need to make any bookings for the masses prior to Christmas which are the weekends of 12-13 and 19,20 December 2020. Masses will be be open to the first 150 people who attend.

You will still need to write your name and contact details on the papers provided. Could you please write one name only on each line and once the booking sheet reaches its capacity please use the next page. Please inform others especially those who have not been comeing to to church due to previous restrictions of this change and invite them to church.

Our priority is making our parish a covid safe place.

6. Sacrament of Reconciliation

Some families have not returned due to illness or worries about COVID. Again, I encourage those families to streamline Mass either from St Mary's Cathedral at 10.30am Sunday or Wollongong at 9.30am on Sundays. In this way the family or individual is giving time to God and their own spiritual life. But TV Mass is not the answer to attending the community and joining in Sunday worship in hearing the Word of God and then, encountering Jesus in Eucharist. If families or family members have become lazy due to being away from worship then, before receiving the Eucharist in good conscience they should go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist.

7. Fr Kene to attend burial of his brother

The burial/funeral of Fr Kene's brother Gerald Chukwuemeka Onwukwe has been scheduled to be held on 28/29 January 2021. He is looking forward to taking an annual leave from 18 January to 15 February 2021 to enable him travel to Nigeria for the burial ceremony. Details of travel to be communicated.

8. Christmas Mass Bookings

Christmas is less than 3 weeks and this year will be unique and different due to COVID-19. To accommodate all worshipers who would like to attend, mass we are having five masses over Christmas. Mass times are Vigil 24th December 5.30pm, 7.30pm and 12 midnight. On Christmas day, 8.30am and 10.30am. Please ring the parish office from 15 December 2020. It is important that you book for your family only. We would be disappointed if too many people miss out.



9. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.
