Dear Parishioners,

**Today we celebrate the
1st Sunday of Lent**

First Reading, God gives Noah the rainbow as a reassuring sign of
God's goodness: he will never again do what he has just done. God
will never again destroy everything with a flood.

The morally sick and destructive population of the old world dies in God's flood

But why isn't it bad enough that God did it once? God brought it about
that every human being, except for Noah and his small family, died by
drowning in one great natural catastrophe. Where is the goodness of
God in the story of the flood? Well, here is one way to think about
God's action.

Consider the medical treatment for certain fatal cancers. For those
deadly diseases, doctors can try to save the patient with an
autologous bone marrow transplant. The doctor takes bone marrow
from the patient and hunts for any cells that are not cancerous. He
saves those healthy cells, but he kills the cancerous ones. Then he
clones the healthy cells and puts them back into the patient. By this
painful measure, there is a chance that the doctor can save the life of
his patient.

In the story of the flood, God tries the analogue of this same
procedure on the human race, doomed to die because of sin. God
takes a few morally healthy human beings and puts them into a new
world, to reproduce there. The morally sick and destructive population
of the old world dies in God's flood.

But, you might think, what dies in the treatment for cancer is only
cells. What died in the flood is human beings!

True, but notice this other difference between the medical treatment
and the flood. In the flood, the selection between the sick and the
healthy people is made by the people themselves. Those who aren't
on Noah's boat don't want to be on it. To get on the boat, they would
have to acknowledge their sins and accept God's means to safety. If
they repented they would be among the healthy, the righteous invited
on the boat. But this is what they refuse to do.

The boat is there for those who don't refuse it. And, as
the **Gospel** reading makes plain, that boat is always there, in Christ,
who saves all those who do not reject him.

And so the rainbow *is* a sign of the goodness of God, who calls
everyone to salvation

2. Covid—19 update

There is a 1 person per 2 square metre rule which applies to all venues, except for gyms. Weddings and funerals will still be subject to a 300-person cap. Masks will only be mandatory on public transport, but will strongly be encouraged in other indoor venues where social distancing is not possible.

What this means for us:

We shall maintain a 2 square metre per person inside our church. It is not compulsory to wear mask. However, it is recommended and especially for the elderly.

8. Stations of the Cross

The way of the Cross is the Way for our Salvation. The Stations of the Cross are held every Friday during the season of Lent after the 9.00am mass. Please join us.

9. Booking for Mass

With the 2 square metre rule in place, there is no need to pre book for Mass. Sheets of paper are provided at the church entrance for you to write your name and contact details. Our priority is making our parish a covid-19 safe parish.

10. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.

14. 2021 Volunteers

15. Catechist

16. Silence in the Church

Allow five minutes before Mass in the church to be a time of silence and quiet reflection in preparation for the celebration of the Eucharist. No group prayer at this time and, at all times, no noise in the church.

17. Information Session on the Ministry of Lectors (Readers)

A call is now being made to those interested in being readers at Liturgies in the church. Please let the parish office know if you are interested. Training and information sessions will be held for the new members and incumbents at a later date.

18. Transportation Assistance Request

Some of the elderly in the parish need assistance in transportation to and from mass either on a Sunday or a weekday mass. If there is anyone in the parish who could help please contact the parish office who can pass on details. Most of the elderly do not live far from the church so there will be little inconvenience involved.

19. Preparation and Information evening for Baptism

There are few adjustments on how and when to conduct baptisms in our parish. The liturgy of Baptism is now conducted on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at 10.30am in the parish church. Parents and godparents of those to be baptised are now required to attend a Baptism information evening prior to the actual date of their children's baptism. This will help to prepare them spiritually and physically for the first sacrament of their children. Please call the parish office on time if you wish to book a baptism.

20. Hand Sanitizer

Please feel free to pick the liquid hand sanitizer on the table at the foyer. We welcome a gold coin donation for parish upkeep. Thanks to George Ajkay for making them available.
