Dear Parishioners,

**Today we celebrate the
5th Sunday of Lent Year B**

In the [Gospel](#), some Greeks ask to see Jesus. Jesus responds by saying that anyone who loves his life will lose it. To gain your life, you have to be like a grain of wheat: it brings forth much fruit only by falling into the earth and dying. **God honors those who seek to honor him.**

The Greeks must have been baffled. What has this speech of Jesus' got to do with their request to see him? But consider those Greeks. They accord Jesus rock star status. They don't even ask to talk to the great man. They want only to see him. And they don't dare come to Jesus directly. They just approach one of his friends, Philip, and they call Philip "Kyrie," that is to say, "Lord." Even Lady Gaga's groupies wouldn't call one of her friends, "Lord," would they?

Jesus' response helps those Greeks to see him—the true Lord, not the rock star the Greeks were looking for. The true Lord did not come to get status and power. He came to lose his life, to fall and die, like a grain of wheat.

The point is made emphatically at the end of Jesus' response to the Greeks. He ends with a prayer: "Father," he prays, "glorify your name." Jesus, the true Lord and not the rock star, came to seek God's glory. He did not come to seek not his own. The final part of the lesson for the Greeks, and for us, comes in God's response to Jesus' prayer. God honors Jesus by answering his prayer out loud: "I have glorified My name, and I will glorify it again!"

"This voice didn't come for my sake, but for yours," Jesus tells the awed bystanders. God's voice came to finish the lesson: God honors those who seek to honor him.

True glory lies not in rock star status, then, but, on the contrary, in being willing to fall and die like a grain of wheat. It lies in being willing to let go, to lose one's life in this world in love for the glory of God's name.

And so the Greeks do get what they asked for. In the response of Jesus to them, they, and we, see the true Lord, and with the true Lord the pattern for racing for glory in our lives, too. Glory, glory, hallelujah!

3. Covid Update

Australia's COVID-19 vaccine is out and will become available in phases. Priority groups have been identified using public health, medical and epidemiological evidence. It is the hope of the Australian Government to have as many people vaccinated as possible in 2021. Identified priority groups will get the first available safe and effective doses of vaccines. More people will have access to a vaccine as more doses become available throughout 2021. The phases range from 1a–3:

- 1a: Quarantine, border and front-line health care workers
 - 1b: Elderly adults (70 and above) and adults with an underlying medical condition; Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people (55 and above).
 - 2a: Adults (50 -69); and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people (18-54).
 - 2b: Remaining adults and others unvaccinated from previous phases
 - 3: Those less than 16 if recommended.
- We hope this helps you get vaccinated at your appropriate time.

6. Singing in the Church

The NSW government have allowed up to 30 performers to sing indoors. The congregation can sing if they maintain 4 square meter rule and wear masks. At this stage, only members of the choir are allowed to sing in our liturgies so as to still maintain our 2 square meter rule. If you would like to sing, it is strongly recommended that you sit with the choir. Thanks for your understanding.

9. Lenten Program

The Lenten program is a wonderful way to pray, know and reflect on the gospel with inputs from different participants. It's never too late to join. They are held every Tuesday during lent in the church at 7pm. Thank you to Wendy Tourle for leading the group.

10. Stations of the Cross

The way of the Cross is the Way for our Salvation. The Stations of the Cross are held every Friday during the season of Lent after the 9.00am mass. Please join us.

11. Booking for Mass

With the 2 square metre rules in place, there is no need to pre book for Mass. Sheets of paper are provided at the church entrance for you to write your name and contact details. Our priority is making our parish a covid-19 safe parish.

12. Silence in the Church

Allow five minutes before Mass in the church to be a time of silence and quiet reflection in preparation for the celebration of the Eucharist. No group prayer at this time and, at all times, no noise in the church.



13. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap." The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount, they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.

14. Transportation Assistance Request

Some of the elderly in the parish need assistance in transportation to and from mass either on a Sunday or a weekday mass. If there is anyone in the parish who could help please contact the parish office who can pass on details. Most of the elderly do not live far from the church so there will be little inconvenience involved.

15. Volunteers

There are so many ministries in the Parish especially behind the scenes. If you feel that your talent or time can be of a service please consider being a volunteer.

16. Easter Confessions

There will be 2nd rite of reconciliation in the parish church on Friday 26 March at 6.30pm. We ask that you utilize the opportunity to prepare for the resurrection of Jesus Christ at Easter.

17. Safeguarding Workshop

A safeguarding workshop has been organized for Wednesday 24 March 2021 at 6.30pm in the hall. If you have commenced a new ministry in our church it is strongly advisable that you attend this workshop. This includes all new and existing acolytes, cleaners and readers (if you have not attended a Workshop in the past) to attend.




