**Dear Parishioners,
Today we celebrate the sixth Sunday of Easter**

In the [Gospel](#) Reading, Christ suggests a remedy for any problem we have. The Father will give you anything you ask for, he says, if you will just ask for it in Christ's name.

But what is it to ask for something in Christ's name? It can't be a matter of simply tacking the name of Christ on to any prayer. "I would like a Porsche, please, *in the name of Christ.*" Prayer isn't magic. It isn't a matter of using the right magical formulas in order to make God do what you want him to do.

Take him as Lord, and you have to recognize that, as Lord, he loves and cares for his own.

It helps here to consider the homely cases in which one person asks something in the name of another. A secretary can ask for the mail in her boss's name: "I'm just here to pick up the mail for my boss!" A child can ask a neighbor for a cup of sugar in his mother's name: "Mrs. Murphy, my mother wants to know if you could lend her a cup of sugar." In these cases, the person asking can ask in the name of another because he somehow identifies himself as in relationship with that other: *my* boss, *my* mother. Something—a connection of shared work, a family relation—binds the two of them together.

To ask in Christ's name is like this, too. You ask in the name of Christ when you are in the kind of relation to him that lets you say "*my*" with respect to him. And what would bind the two of you together in this way? What should follow that "*my*"? It shouldn't be "*my servant,*" as the magician in effect says in his heart of hearts. No, not "*my servant,*" but "*my Lord.*"

Take him as Lord, and you have to recognize that, as Lord, he loves and cares for his own. He knows what to give to those who are *his* in answer to their prayers. So if you ask the Father for something in the name of Christ, then you are doing the opposite of what the magician does: you ask being prepared to accept what *your Lord* wants to give you. What you are given will be a good gift if it is in accord with his will, even if it isn't in accord with yours.

2. Happy Mother's Day

The parish of St. Anthony of Padua wish all mothers especially mothers of our parish a Happy Mother's Day.

3. Silence in the Church

Allow five minutes before Mass in the church to be a time of silence and quiet reflection in preparation for the celebration of the Eucharist. No group prayer at this time and, at all times, no noise in the church.

4. Volunteers

There are so many ministries in the Parish especially behind the scenes. If you feel that your talent or time can be of a service please consider being a volunteer.

5. Direct Debit via Giving Point Tap

Due to the COVID virus, the Archdiocese has asked that parishes include a Donation Point Tap device for use by parishioners who are not carrying cash. Many young families do not carry much cash nowadays, but use credit cards and so, this is a further reason to introduce "The Donation Point Tap. "The device is set at \$5.00, so that the \$5 will be allocated to the Collections. If parishioners wish to give above this amount, they either "tap again" or use the collection plate as it passes by. Parishioners wishing to claim a Tax Deduction for their giving will need to take up a set of Parish Envelopes and support the community through the envelope system.

6. Mass Attendance Count

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has advised that the 2021 National Count of Attendance (Mass Count) will take place over the first four weekends in May (starting 1 May 2021 and concluding 23 May). Thank you to the counters who have volunteered to assist. Please endeavour to be counted by being present on those four weekends

7. Welcome to our Parish

We are a growing community and we are happy to have all of you who have moved recently to become members of our Parish community. If there is any way we can be of help to make you comfortable, do not hesitate to contact us through the parish office. Please collect a Parish Census form at the foyer, fill it out and give to Fr Kene or send to the parish office.

8. Booking of Mass Intentions

For any Mass intentions you will like to have, please use the Mass Intention envelopes at the church foyer, clearly fill in the details and leave on the collection plate or give to Fr Kene when it is convenient to do so. Another option is to contact the parish office on Tuesdays and Thursdays earlier.

9. Pentecost Prayers of the Faithful

Those who would like to join in saying the Prayers of the Faithful at the 5.30pm and 9.00am mass on the weekend of 22 and 23 May 2021, Pentecost weekend, from different languages are invited to contact the parish office. Thank you to those who have volunteered thus far.

10. The Sacristy and Electricals

Our church Sacristy is too small to contain even a few numbers of people who must use it at a given time. So, I ask that if you do not have important need to go in there, especially when the priest, Acolytes and Altar servers (with their parent/s vesting them) are getting ready for Mass, please do not go in. Thanks for understanding. Same goes for the electronic gadgets and electricals in the church. They are sophisticatedly wired so a little misapplication can disrupt the whole system. If you do not know how to operate them and you need it for your ministry, please contact us for a short training.

11. Children's Liturgy

We would like to re- introduce Children's Liturgy back into the weekend masses. If you would like to volunteer, please let the parish office know. Even though you were a volunteer prior to Covid, please confirm that you will continue to be part of the children's liturgy team. The masses it will cover will be the 5.30pm and the 9am masses only. All new volunteers are welcome.

12. Monday Prayer

The Monday Rosary prayer that stopped due to COVID-19 will resume again on every Monday morning at 10am, here at St Anthony of Padua Church. Through the Rosary, we unite ourselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in living life of true faith and devotion. You are welcome to join us in praying for your intentions and intentions of the world. The Rosary prayer starts this Monday 3rd May.

13. Holy Communion

Our Parish will be holding a compulsory information evening on Wednesday 19th May at 7pm in our Church. Please attend if you wish your child to make their First Holy Communion this June. Your child does not need to attend. If you cannot come to the meeting, please contact the Parish office to make an appointment with Fr Kene.
