Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

The Lord is my Shepherd, [Psalm 23](#) says, but there are human shepherds, too.

In the [First Reading](#) God thunders against the human shepherds who are failures at shepherding.

Every person has many of God's children in his care.

Who are these miserable shepherds, these failures, with whom God is so indignant? Well, you can tell who they are by what God is angry at in them. They are the human beings who have not cared for the sheep, and those sheep are God's people.

Well, what did the shepherds fail to do when they failed to care for the sheep? They didn't help the sheep get nurture; they drove the sheep away. They led the sheep in wrong directions. They scattered the sheep, so that instead of being one flock, the sheep were divided against each other into diverse small groups.

So think about it this way. Do you lust for someone who is not your spouse? Do you think you are caring for one of God's children when you do? Do you smoke and overeat? What impact do your bad habits have on God's children? Is there no one of God's people who will grieve over you when you get sick? Do you laze around and waste your gifts by doing nothing?

Do you spend your time on foolish, frivolous things that help nobody? Do you think you are caring for God's people when you do? Do you gossip and undermine the reputation of others? Do you sow discord in your neighbourhood, in your church, in your family? Are you a divisive presence in your community? Do you think you are caring for God's children when you are? Surely no one of us is so benighted as to suppose that God's thundering against miserable shepherds is meant only for priests who aren't good enough. That thundering is a warning for each one of us. Every person has many of God's children in his care. The woman who empties your trash at work, the child in the row behind you who kicks your seat on the plane, the annoying non-stop talker at your dinner table, your old and highly inadequate mother, your very imperfect spouse—each of these is one of God's children, and each of them is in your care—a little or maybe even a lot. All these are people that we ourselves shepherd—always with our Shepherd, whose grace we need to do it well.

Let us be careful not to be miserable shepherds for him.

We shall all survive this Pandemic

The extended lockdown will be challenging for all of us. No doubt, this is a trying time for families and for religious families like us St. Anthony's. I hope our individual efforts in keeping to the rules of the lockdown and restriction will significantly reduce the cases popping up here and there in the area.

I encourage us to be firm and hopeful as we work from home, support our children in their home schooling and etc. As with the Israelites who endured all the difficulties and persevered for forty years in the desert to reach the promised land, so our 'promised land' is in sight. When we are proactive in doing what we should do at this time – stay at home and go out only for the essentials, have our Covid jab and get tested when we feel sick – we shall definitely have the last laugh, even if with slight 'new normal'.

Today's gospel chronicles the return of the Apostles from the mission they were sent by Jesus from last weekend's readings. The tone of their report showed they were successful in doing and teaching what they learned from their Master, Jesus Christ. It is only in God that our success will come from. When we apply his virtues and teachings in everything we do, we see ourselves surviving and being successful even in difficult situations and settings. Obedience, patience and humility are the virtues found and taught by Christ. It will be wonderful to report to God that in our Christian living at this time, we applied those virtues in keeping to the rules to stop the spread of the virus.


11. Working with Children Check
